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## The oldest universities on the American continent are in Mexico.

**The oldest continuously operating American university is** the Colegio de San Nicolás Hidalgo located in Morelia, Michoacan, originally founded in nearby Pátzcuaro in 1540 for the study of theology and religion. This institution is known today as the "Universidad Michoacana de San Nicolás de Hidalgo."

The main difference between the Mexican university system and that of the U.S. or Canada is that all universities are divided in faculties, which offer different degrees related to the faculty, for example, the Engineering Faculty offers degrees as Industrial Engineering, Mechanic Engineering, Computer's Engineering, etc. The syllabus is linked to the degree that one is studying, and these degrees may last from four to six years, according to the specialty that the student chooses. During the last phase of study, students are required to do social service and write a thesis on responsibilities to society.

In Mexico, the government finances public universities and private institutions finance the private universities. Public schools are also autonomous, which means that the government does not interfere with their administration, and allows them to create their own syllabus, to establish enrollment conditions and to choose the chancellor of the institution.

Many higher-level institutions in Mexico have exchange programs with schools all over the world. These universities have great facilities and services to offer international students, and Mexican students are always eager to share their ideas and their beliefs with students from other countries.

### Colima

Known as the "City of Palms," the sub-tropical city of Colima is the state capital of the state of Colima and was founded in 1527 as Villa San Sebastián de Colima. This quaint city boasts beautiful colonial architecture and monuments. It is situated on the western side of Mexico on the Pacific coast below the peaks of two volcanoes, Volcán del Fuego (active) and El Nevado (dormant).

### Universidad Autonoma de Colima Academic Spanish Program for Foreigners (EAPE)

Established in 1970, Universidad de Colima is recognized by the presidency of Mexico as an institution with great quality programs, making it one of the ten university members of CUMex (Consortium of Mexican universities).

Universidad de Colima offers a Spanish for Academic Purposes (EAPE) course, which enables students to enroll in three different proficiency levels of Spanish: beginner, intermediate, and advanced levels. All three levels include a study of conversational Spanish grammar, writing, and culture. The intermediate and advanced courses also include the study of literature. Each level is limited to a maximum of 20 students, which ensures good teacher/student relationships. The EAPE program has been especially designed for non-native Spanish speakers who need to learn the language or increase their Spanish language skills for academic or personal reasons.

## Cuernavaca

## Puebla
